




Summary

Based on the recorded wildlife species as stated in Table 1, the active wildlife species recorded consists of *Bearded Pig (32%)*, *Borneo Pygmy Elephant (18%) and Long-tailed Macaque (20%)*, with an overall total of 276 wildlife were directly or indirectly sighted. Six HCV Priority Species were recorded consists of *Bornean Pygmy Elephant, Bornean Banteng/Tambadau, Bornean Orangutan, Bearded Pig, Sambar Deer and Bornean Gibbon.*
