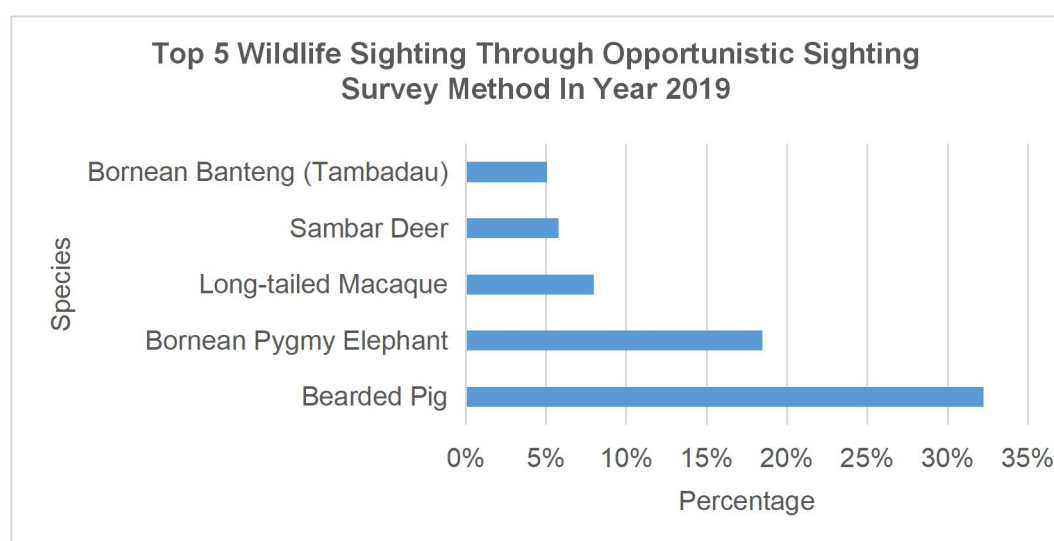

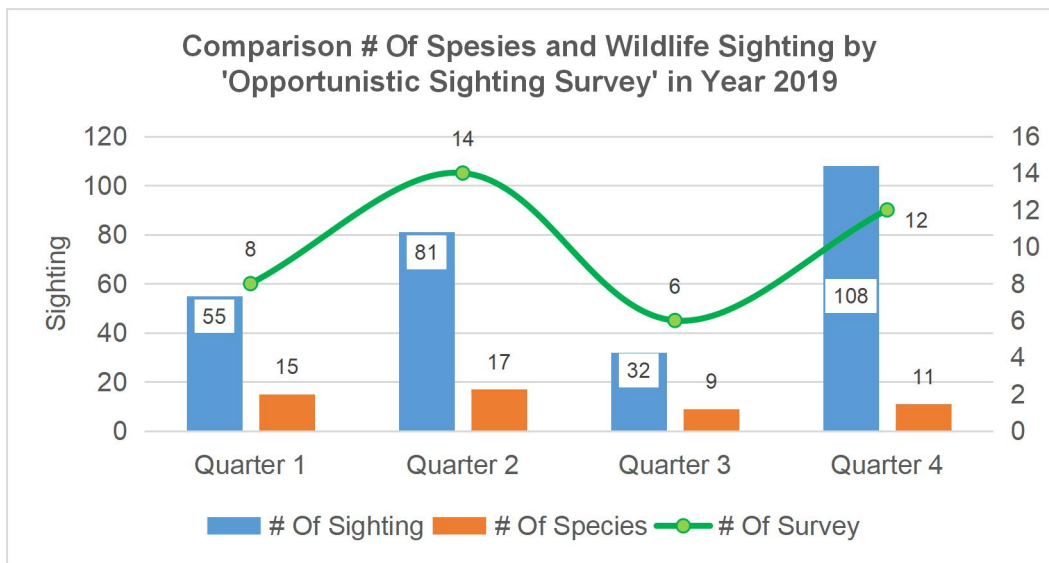
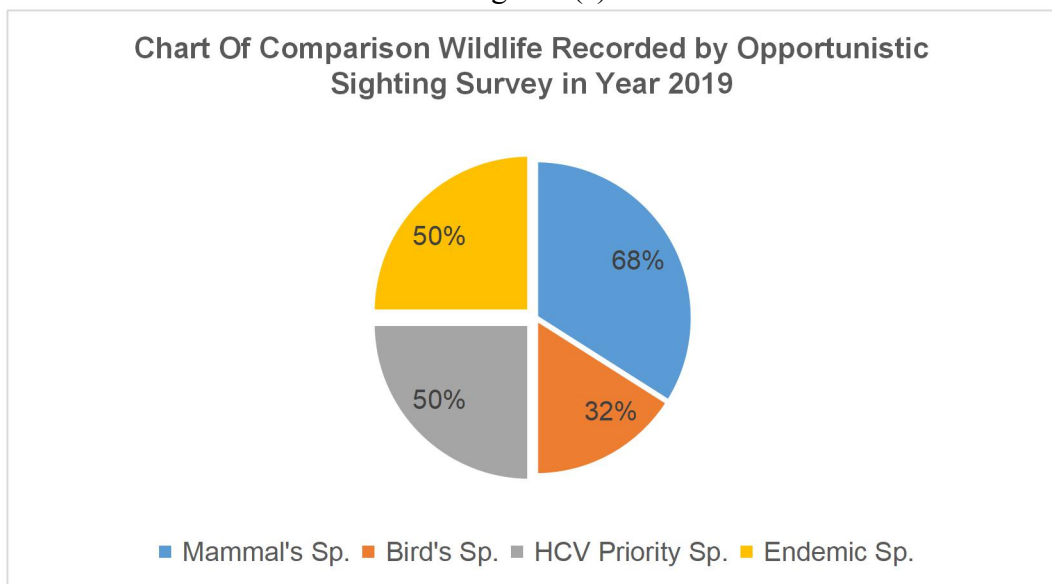

Summary

Based on the recorded wildlife species as stated in Table 1, the active wildlife species recorded consists of *Bearded Pig (32%)*, *Borneo Pygmy Elephant (18%)* and *Long-tailed Macaque (20%)*, with an overall total of 276 wildlife were directly or indirectly sighted. Six HCV Priority Species were recorded consists of *Bornean Pygmy Elephant*, *Bornean Banteng/Tambadau*, *Bornean Orangutan*, *Bearded Pig*, *Sambar Deer* and *Bornean Gibbon*.
