These are some of the common birds found in Sabah. Featured here are selected ones found in open areas (grasslands, gardens and within town areas) and those that can be sighted at forest edges.

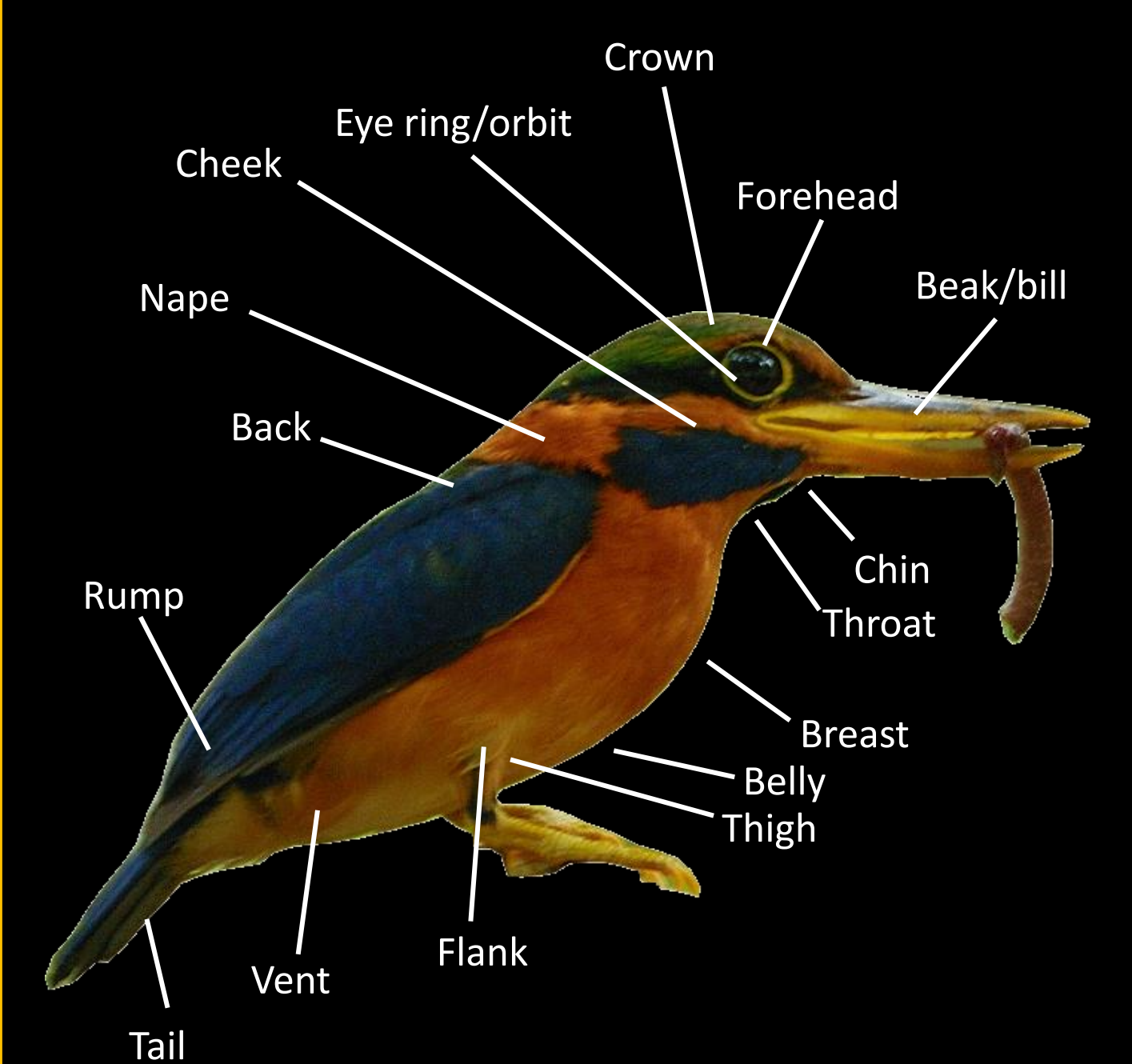
